Thought for the Week

In today's Gospel, Jesus is once again in conflict with the Pharisees, many of whom were good and Holy people believing they were defending the integrity of their Religion. They cannot see who Jesus is, nor can they hear and understand His teaching about the Kingdom of God.

In the dramatic exchange, Jesus deals with them with open honesty and gentle firmness. He stuns them with the challenge to think deeply about what truly belongs to God.

Along with Justice, Jesus made peace a central theme of His Ministry and Teaching. Peace on earth was the opening proclamation of His birth. His Ministry of forgiveness and reconciliation brought people together again, with God and with each other.

World Mission Sunday is celebrated in every Parish throughout the World. It is a great opportunity to express solidarity with our Brothers and Sisters in Christ who are living in situations of poverty, violence and oppression.

Pope Francis' Message for World Mission Sunday speaks of the power of the Gospel in overcoming evil. "We can think too of countless testimonies to how the Gospel helps to overcome narrowness, conflict, racism, tribalism, and to promote everywhere, and among all, reconciliation, fraternity, and sharing".

CALLED AND GIFTED AT ST BEDE'S

Save the date – Saturday 11th November 9am – 5pm - Called and Gifted starts at St Bede's.

The **first stage** is a teaching day. It explains the Church's teaching on the role of the laity and the Parish in the mission of the Church to the world. It discusses the critical role of charisms in our life and service of others, and the signs and characteristics of 23 common charisms. This usually takes place on a Saturday, between about 9am and 4.30pm in a Parish.

The **second stage** is a private discernment Conversation with a trained member of the team, which will help you recognise patterns in your life that might indicate the presence of a charism.

The **third stage** is meeting three times in a small discernment group, following a process to look in detail at using one charism in your everyday life. Usually there about 5 people in the group. All Parishioners will then meet together at the end, with their Parish Priest and perhaps members of a Parish Council or Evangelisation Strategy Team, to share experiences and confirmed charisms, and look at how the community can support each person in using their charisms in their everyday life as well as for the mission of the Church
