Thought for the Week

Over the last few weeks St Mark's Gospel has been concerned about the cost of discipleship. Jesus has taught the disciples that the Son of Man will suffer grievously and that they are called to share that suffering. His followers have been taught that the Christian way demands constant acceptance of God's will, from the rejection of divorce to the need to lose everything, if necessary, to be one with God. Alongside this challenging instruction we find the disciples squabbling about which of them will be the greatest in the Kingdom of Heaven! Their focus, as is ours most of the time, is on earthly things – importance of wealth and of status. Like us they do not want to focus on the reality of Christian discipleship in this world – sacrifice, rejection, possible martyrdom before the glory of resurrection.

In our Gospel this weekend Jesus puts James and John on the spot "can you drink the cup that I must drink, or be baptised with the baptism with which I must be baptised?" They reply " We can." Do they really understand what they are accepting? At this stage, probably not! Jesus is offering them the greatest sign of discipleship, the willingness to drink the cup of suffering for the Kingdom and baptism in the blood of the Lamb who takes away the sins of the world. Probably unknowingly, they agreed to conform themselves to Christ the Suffering Servant, to be one with their master in the fulfilment of the prophesy of Isaiah in our first reading.

Whenever we enter into the celebration of the sacrifice of the Mass we too, often unknowingly, reply with James and John that we accept cost of discipleship before reaching its glory. Whenever we drink the blood of the Lord in Eucharist we say "yes!" to joining the Suffering Servant who is Christ. As the second reading reminds us "we must never let go of the faith that we have professed."







Baptism: the baptisms of infants and children are held monthly at St Bede's on designated Sundays only either during Sunday Mass or at 3pm. First time parents are required to attend a baptism preparation course.

Marriage: couples wishing to marry in the Catholic Church here or elsewhere should notify the parish office at least six months before the proposed marriage. This is to give sufficient time for the pre-nuptial enquiries. Couples are required to attend a marriage preparation course.

Year of Faith



The Catechism of the Catholic Church – what is it?

The Catechism aims to present the teaching of Sacred Scripture, the living Tradition in the Church and the authentic Magisterium, as well as the spiritual heritage of the Church, so that the power and beauty of the faith is made clear. It is a reference text addressed primarily to bishops and other teachers of the faith. The Catechism is arranged in four parts: The Profession of Faith (the Creed), The Celebration of the Christian Mystery (the liturgy and the sacraments), Life in Christ (Christian witness), and Christian Prayer (especially the 'Our Father'). In order to make the Catechism more widely known and deeply understood, the Church has produced two other (shorter) texts: The Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church, and YOUCAT: Youth Catechism of the Catholic Church.

BAMENDA/PORTSMOUTH LINK, Part 2

Cameroon, officially the Republic of Cameroon is a country in west Central Africa. It is bordered by Nigeria to the west; Chad to the northeast; the Central African Republic to the east; and Equatorial Guinea, Gabon, and the Republic of the Congo to the south. Cameroon's coastline lies on part of the Gulf of Guinea and the Atlantic Ocean.

The country is called "Africa in miniature" for its geological and cultural diversity. Natural features include beaches, deserts, mountains, rainforests, and savannahs. Cameroon was discovered by the Portuguese in the 15th century when they arrived the coastal regions and discovered lots of Prawns. They named it Rio de Cameroes, meaning "River of Prawns". It was from this that the name Cameroon developed. Cameroon became a German colony in 1884 and they called it Kamerun. After the First World War which ended in 1918, in which Germany was defeated, all her territories were seized by the victorious nations led by Britain and France. Cameroon was one of these territories and the two leading powers of the victorious nations (i.e France and Britain) shared the territory as League of Nation Mandates. The British took just about 20% of the territory of what is known today as the North West and South West Regions of Cameroon. The remaining 80% of the country was occupied by the French. These two territories of the French and British Cameroons were administered separately by their occupying masters.
