

Thought for the Week

When the Queen goes visiting she is often ‘treated’ to the smell of freshly painted walls, apparently. This is because wherever she visits people seem to want to spruce the place up. When, for example, she visited the USA a few years ago the preparations involved many people over many weeks. Staff at the hotel in Virginia that was to provide her with one night’s accommodation felt it necessary to wash the sheets on her bed four times – and that was before she used them! The hotel’s painters and decorators were busy applying fresh paint to all the corridors just in case she turned an unexpected corner. Meanwhile in Washington DC the chefs preparing the food at the White House asked about her dietary preferences only to be told she never expresses any such preference – presumably in case she gets given it too often. And the man chosen to guide her round a local historic site went online to learn just how to address his distinguished guest.

This Sunday the Church begins making preparations for a different kind of visit and a different kind of distinguished guest. The season of Advent instructs us in how to prepare ourselves for the coming of Christ who just last Sunday we acclaimed as Universal King. There are no sheets to be washed nor menus prepared but we are urged by the apostle Paul to ‘make more and more progress in the kind of life’ that God wants (1 Thess 3). The Son of Man is coming and while we wait we should, says Jesus, not become so caught up with the ‘cares of life’ that his arrival is sprung on us a sudden (Lk 21).

Such instruction from the Word of the Lord comes amid all the preparations for the celebration of the first coming of Christ. Amid that premature business I think it’s helpful to be reminded that Christ’s second coming is a visit we should not overlook. As we journey into Advent let us be unafraid to ask ourselves in prayer and silence: to what extent does our life now show a real readiness to welcome our distinguished guest, Jesus Christ our Saviour and King?





Insights from Vatican 2 on the Liturgy

Sacrosanctum Concilium is a document from the Second Vatican Council concerning the liturgy. It views the Church as a diversified people of faith, gathered in unity around the bishop, each with their own role. 'Liturgical services are not private functions, but are celebrations of the Church, which is the "sacrament of unity", namely, the holy people united and ordered under their bishops. Therefore liturgical services pertain to the whole body of the Church... they concern the individual members of the Church in different ways, according to their differing rank, office, and actual participation.' (para 26)
'All should hold in great esteem the liturgical life of the diocese centred around the bishop, especially in his cathedral church...' (para 41)

BAMENDA/PORTSMOUTH LINK

(Fr Thom's narrative on Bamenda - Part 7 of 7)

Linking the Diocese of Portsmouth with the Archdiocese of Bamenda Cameroon since 1974

As earlier mentioned, 70% of the population of Bamenda are in rural areas and carry out subsistent farming as their main occupation. Majority of the people of these areas are not literate and so, many of the children find it difficult going to school due to the inability of the parents to pay the fees. At the moment many charity groups have been assisting to alleviate the situation. It is in this light that I wish to appeal to groups, families, or individuals for assistance. In the Archdiocese of Bamenda, it costs about £20 to pay the fees of one child in the Primary school for one academic year, and about £40 for the nursery school. Are you able to support a child or more go to school? Then this is your opportunity to do so. If you may even like to link with a family that you support or a school that you want to support, then everything can be made possible.

Structures needed. Many areas do not have structures or enough classrooms for studies. In many areas, two classes are merged into one and children are crowded in one room due to insufficient structures. Are you also able to do something in this regard?
