Thought for the Week

This week-end the Church in England and Wales keeps Peace Sunday. During this Year of Faith, we are asked to look again at the Second Vatican Council document "Gaudium et Spes" which looked at our modern world towards the end of the last century. One of its important statements is that Peace cannot be seen merely as the absence of war; Peace is intimately linked with the establishment of Justice in our daily lives and in our systems of government. Without a proper understanding of Justice, hatred, selfishness, xenophobia and other evils will result in unrest, disorder and even war.

In his message for this Peace Sunday, Pope Benedict reminds us of some important facts about Peace; on how to be peacemakers. True peacemakers "are those who love, defend and promote human life in all its dimensions", actively opposing abortion and euthanasia, so upholding the right of life for all, especially those who are innocent.

Essential to a peaceful society, he declares, is a proper understanding of marriage and the family, without which society will eventually collapse. In the 20th Century, Communism and Nazism attempted to obliterate a Christian idea of marriage, resulting in a morality which was incapable of developing societies concerned with the good of all rather than a political elite focused on its own aims and objectives.

Pope Benedict also condemns the inequality which exists between the rich and the poor, the result of "the prevalence of a selfish and individualistic mindset which also finds expression in an unregulated financial capitalism".

Many will be surprised to learn that he regards the greatest threat to peace to be Relativism, which encourages a morality empty of the "natural moral law inscribed by God upon the conscience of every man and woman." We are called not to seek our own individual comfort and serenity, but that of all people as children of God. Peace Sunday this year asks us: do We? Fr Patrick Tansey




