### **A summary of Pope Benedict's Message for Lent 2013**

The celebration of Lent offers us a valuable opportunity to meditate on the relationship between faith and charity: between believing in God – the God of Jesus Christ – and love, which is the fruit of the Holy Spirit and which guides us on the path of devotion to God and others.

In my first Encyclical, I observed that “being Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction.” The entire Christian life is a response to God's love. The first response is faith as acceptance, filled with wonder and gratitude, of the unprecedented divine initiative that precedes us and summons us. And the “yes” of faith marks the beginning of a radiant story of friendship with the Lord, which fills and gives meaning to our life. When we make room for the love of God, then we become like him, sharing in his own charity.

The Christian life consists in continuously scaling the mountain to meet God and then coming back down, bearing the love and strength drawn from him, so as to serve our brothers and sisters with God's own love. In sacred Scripture, we see how the zeal of the Apostles to proclaim the Gospel and awaken people's faith is closely related to their charitable concern to be of service to the poor (cf. Acts 6:1-4). Sometimes we tend to reduce the term “charity” to simply humanitarian aid. It is important, however, to remember that the greatest work of charity is evangelization, which is the “ministry of the word”. There is no action more beneficial – and therefore more charitable – towards one's neighbour than to break the bread of the word of God, to introduce him to a relationship with God. Lent invites us to nourish our faith by careful listening to the word of God and by receiving the sacraments, and at the same time to grow in charity and in love for God and neighbour, not least through the specific practices of fasting, penance and almsgiving.

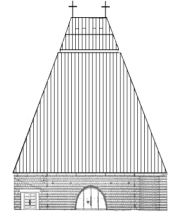
Dear brothers and sisters, in this season of Lent, as we prepare to celebrate the event of the Cross and Resurrection – in which the love of God redeemed the world and shone its light upon history – I express my wish that all of you may spend this precious time rekindling your faith in Jesus Christ, so as to enter with him into the dynamic of love for the Father and for every brother and sister that we encounter in our lives. For this intention, I raise my prayer to God!

### Parish Website

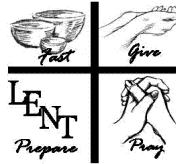

### Lent begins...

*A time to prepare for Holy Week's commemoration of Our Lord's Passion, Death and Resurrection.*

**Ash Wednesday:** Masses: 12.15pm Holy Ghost & 7.30pm St Bede's. It is a day of fasting & abstinence when Catholics aged 18-59 and whose health enables them to do so are asked to fast by noticeably reducing their intake of food and drink and to abstain from something they like giving them time for spiritual things like reading the Bible or works of charity.

**Get up for an early Mass:** starting this Thursday there will during Lent be a 6.30 am Thursday Mass at St Bede's followed by breakfast in the Hall. Do come. Last year over fifty of us did and loved the experience.

**Support CAFOD with a soup lunch:** if you would like to organise one during Lent either at St Bede's or in your own home please sign up on the relevant sheets in the foyer. All we ask is that you invite your guests to donate to CAFOD and at the end of Lent we will send the donations off to them. The lunches should be held anytime between 18th Feb and 23rd Mar.

**Deepen the faith you have:** Starting last week and continuing through Lent and Eastertide is a new series of weekly sessions for Catholics wishing to discover more about their faith. Last week we explored what it means to profess faith in God the Father. This Tuesday at 7.30pm we will explore what it means to profess faith in Jesus Christ.
