**Thought of the Week**

Today in the Gospel, Jesus is telling His disciples about the kind of leadership He wants to see in His Church. But they seem deaf to what He says. He has to remind them that if they are to be His disciples they will have to follow Him to Jerusalem, where He will be arrested by the political leaders and then killed. He has told them already that His leadership will involve suffering and He will tell them a third time as they journey to Jerusalem. But this crucial lesson falls on deaf ears. The disciples don't understand why the Messiah should suffer and they are afraid to ask Him because it is a message they don't want to hear. They want to talk about another topic as they walk along. When Jesus asks them what they are so concerned about, they are shamed into silence. The conversation has been about who is the greatest among them, who wields the most power. Who is the top dog?

Jesus knows how dangerous it is to challenge our deep desire for rank and prestige. He would have known our first reading from the book of Wisdom, which explains how powerful, godless men hate the virtuous and gentle people who question their dominance, and they will even kill them. And St. James in the second reading confirms this. Those who are envious and ambitious for power, when they are thwarted, will turn to violence, Jesus knows His disciples are caught up in this desire for power, so He challenges them. Leadership in His Church must be based on service, so the one who wants to be first must be last. And to drive home the message, He puts a little child in front of them. The disciples, in that culture, would have seen children as lowly nonentities. But Jesus tells them they must learn to welcome not just the powerful, but these insignificant children. If they do, they will be welcoming Jesus Himself.
