**Thought for the week**

Today's second reading suggests that discrimination between rich and poor people had even infiltrated the early Church. James invokes the Old Testament belief that God's special care is given to poor people, choosing them to be "rich in faith" and "heirs to the kingdom which he promised to those who love him". Such teaching goes against the grain for in every age the overriding inclination is to go with wealth and the power it brings, and to look on poor people with indifference. Yet Jesus chose the life of a poor man; he had "nowhere to lay his head" and, in Paul's words, "he became poor for your sake, to make you rich out of his poverty.

In his public ministry Jesus' love embraced everyone, and he bridged the great divide between rich and poor people, not in a material way but through increasing their love and faith. The miracle in today's Gospel, in which Jesus urges a man who is deaf and speaks with difficulty, can be seen not only as physical healing but also as a spiritual gift that brings the man to a deeper faith. Mark gives the incident a symbolic meaning: the man is taken apart from the crowd and receives the ability to hear and to speak of what he has heard and understood, whereas the disciples, though they were privileged to be constantly in the presence of Jesus, so often failed to understand what they had heard. Significantly, Jesus' injunction to tell no one about what has happened is given to the onlookers but not to the man; for he believes in Jesus and knows the meaning of what the Lord has done for him.

## BRINGING CHILDREN TO CHURCH

Bringing a small child to Sunday Mass can be a stressful and anxious time for Parents. Everyone should be welcome in church and Jesus himself drew the little children to Him. So how can parents make it through Sunday Mass in one piece?

Plan ahead for quiet activities to be used only in Church. A cloth bag or special 'Sunday bag' of a couple of quiet, soft toys and age appropriate books. For toddlers, allow time on a Sunday morning or before Mass to choose the books for that bag. Don't bring noisy toys, cars, or clattering pens etc. Pack a sippy cup of water, but please do pack food or sweets. Children can go without food for an hour, and it is not respectful to learn to eat in Church. Children can sit though endless TV or a film without munching and going to the toilet, and using food as a reward is not a healthy habit!

Sit near the front. Sitting up near the front puts your children near the action. There is more for them to look at and pay attention.

Remember, it is not effective to take a young child out of a church service for 'misbehaving' and then let them run around having fun. Also, running around the church from pew to pew and jumping over the kneelers is very disrespectful to those who are in church.

As a reward at the end of Mass for being well behaved, why not take them up to light a candle or take a close look at the statues and flowers, and also allow them to socialise with other parishioners, in the courtyard or in the cloister area.

Parents', please do not get discouraged. Reverence in Church takes many, many weeks and years of training.
