THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

In the Gospel, the two disciples of John the Baptist are also in listening mode. They have committed to following John in response to an inner call from God. And yet now John, in effect, sends them away to listen to the voice of another—Jesus, “the lamb of God”. It’s not that they have been mishearing by listening to John. But John knows that a deeper listening is now needed, that there is someone better to listen to, someone—as John would go on to say—more powerful than he, someone filled with God’s Holy Spirit. The two disciples go home with Jesus and spend the rest of the day with him, listening to him. And Jesus’ words, like Samuel’s are effective: in those few hours, they transform Andrew so dramatically that he is able to say to his brother Peter: “We have found the Messiah.” They have found what their inner voice had called them to look for. When we listen to the Lord, when we encounter the Messiah, our lives are changed.
