THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

It is not for us to stand in judgement on one another, but to mirror the welcome of Jesus even for those whose beliefs and practices we find strange or shocking. This isn't to say "anything goes". But it is to proclaim the Christian belief that everyone can find a home in the family of Jesus. Our first task is to keep the door to this family wide open, to make space for others to enter in God's own time and way, however "other" they may seem to us. Pope Francis teaches this powerfully in Evangelii Gaudium, "The Joy of the Gospel", where he reminds us that the Eucharist is "not a prize for the perfect but a powerful medicine and nourishment for the weak". He goes on, "the Church is not a tollhouse; it is the house of the Father, where there is a place for everyone, with all their problems". It is not for us to judge, but to recognise our own sinfulness and to offer the same welcome and compassion that we hope to receive ourselves. That is why forgiveness is at the heart of the prayer Jesus taught us. He puts the grace of forgiving and being forgiven alongside daily survival itself.

ATTENDING MASS DURING LOCKDOWN

During the current lockdown, we can attend Mass whilst following the guidance on the safe use of places of worship. We must not mingle with anyone outside of our household or support bubble and we must maintain strict social distancing at all times. The clinically vulnerable should follow the guidance on shielding. Please continue to observe the following;

- * Wear a face mask at all times except when receiving Holy Communion
- * Apply hand sanitizer when entering and leaving the church
- * Toilets remain closed and the Cloister must be kept clear
- * The number of parishioners at each Mass will be limited and the maximum stated when you book tickets
- * Please do not enter the Sacristy area via the side door in the Church as this is an emergency exit only
- * QR Codes are displayed in the entrance to the church for you to scan using your mobile for Track and Trace.

DISTRIBUTION OF ASHES IN TIME OF PANDEMIC

To ensure safety during Mass on Ash Wednesday, the priest will "sprinkle the ashes with Holy Water, without saying anything." Then he will address all those present only ONCE saying "Repent, and believe in the Gospel", or "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return". The priest will then cleanse his hands, put on a face mask and distribute the ashes to those who come to him as we do during Holy Communion. If needed he will go to those restricted in movement. The priest will sprinkle the ashes on the head of each one without saying anything. *The distribution of ashes will take place within Mass at 9.30 am in St. Bede's Church and 6.00 pm at Holy Ghost. Outside Mass will be at 12 noon in both Holy Ghost and St. Bede's Church.*



LENT 2021

Lent is a time to prepare for Holy Week's commemoration of Our Lord's Passion, Death and Resurrection.

As well as giving something up this Lent, why not think about attending an extra Mass (all Masses are live-streamed), spend time with the Lord in front of the Blessed Sacrament or focus on Lent by reading and reflecting on the Sunday Mass readings. During Lent we do not say the Gloria or the Alleluia and flowers do not decorate the church until Easter.
