THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

The word "repent", which we heard in today's Gospel, is derived from the Greek word *metanoia*, which means a change of heart, seeing things differently, a new direction, a fresh beginning. The Gospel writers tell us that it was after John the Baptist had been arrested that Jesus began his mission with the message, "Repent, and believe the Good News." Jesus prepared for this by spending time in the wilderness, where he was, in Mark's words, "tempted by Satan". Matthew and Luke give more details of his temptation, telling of how the devil tried to persuade Jesus to turn stones into bread, or to seek political power and influence, or to abandon his commitment to the Kingdom of God. Our first two readings use images relating to water to convey the idea of a new start. The covenant between God and Noah, made after the great flood, is symbolised by the rainbow, which is itself caused by light refracting through water droplets. Through the water of baptism, referred to by Peter in his letter, we are saved by a pledge "made to God from a good conscience", not from fear. This is the repentance, the change of direction, which Jesus preached—going forward with joy, knowing that the Lord is with us.
