THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

Today Jesus is teaching in the synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and affliction. He travels far and wide to the towns and villages, and wherever His ministry takes Him. Then He retires to a remote place to pray and to contemplate the glory of his Father. In today's first reading, Isaiah proclaims, "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light." In the Gospel, Matthew echoes Isaiah's prophecy – but the Messiah, the Christ, is already present. The response to the psalm, with its focus on light, links the two readings: "The Lord is my light and salvation" – before moving into contemplative mode because the promised Light of the World has come. As a result, the psalmist has only one longing in his heart: "One thing have I asked of the Lord, that will I seek after: that I may dwell in the house of the Lord all the days of my life, to gaze upon the beauty of the Lord and to inquire in His temple." The purpose of prophecy is to challenge, to encourage and to prompt to action. Therefore, gazing on the beauty of the Lord is reciprocal: we are in turn gazed upon by the Lord; His gaze is benign, loving and accepting. In gazing upon the Lord, and with the Lord gazing on us, we are drawn into deeper communion with Him.

SIX HOLY HABITS

With the start of a New Year why not think about putting into practice the Six Holy Habits? The first is to keep Sunday special, as a family day, by attending Mass, the 'source and summit' of the Christian life. The second is to resolve to spend at least five minutes a day in prayer, at whatever time you find best, using the Scriptures, ideally the Gospel of the day. The third is to keep Friday as a day of penance and charity in honour of the Lord's Passion, intentionally serving the poor and needy. The fourth is at least once a fortnight to pay a private visit to church for a short period of prayer before the Blessed Sacrament. The fifth is to go to Confession once a month or so and the sixth is to join a small group for formation, prayer and fellowship, where you can share with others your own experience and hear what God is doing in the lives of others. These six holy habits, if we adopt them in the right spirit, entrusting ourselves to the Lord and His grace, offer a practical programme to bring about deep spiritual renewal in ourselves and in our parish communities.

POPE LEO JANUARY PRAYER INTENTION

During January Pope Leo asks us to pray for prayer with the Word of God. *Let us pray that praying with the word of God be nourishment for our lives and a source of hope in our communities, helping us to build a more fraternal and missionary Church.*



SUNDAY OF THE WORD OF GOD

The Third Sunday of the Year is also 'Bible Sunday,' the Sunday of the Word of God. Pope Francis instituted this day in 2019 saying that it "is to be devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the Word of God."
